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

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Campaign Goals and Strategies


Over-Arching Goals

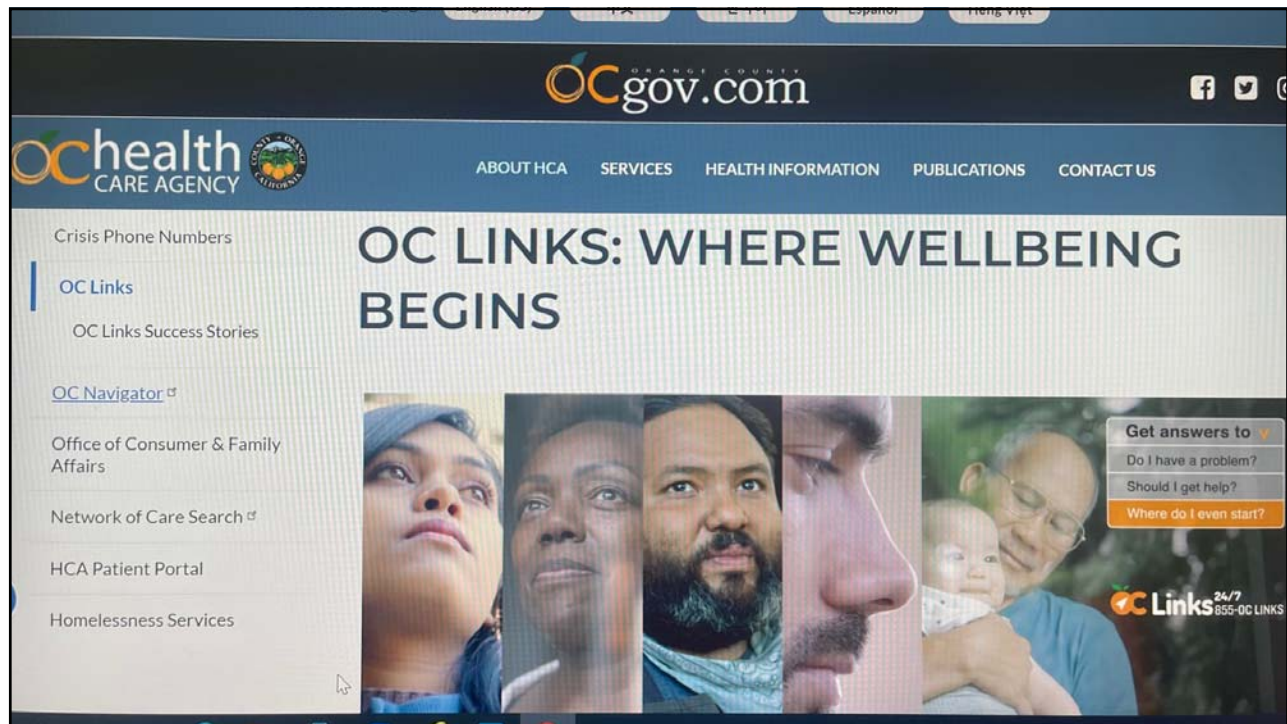
Where Wellbeing Begins: OC Links

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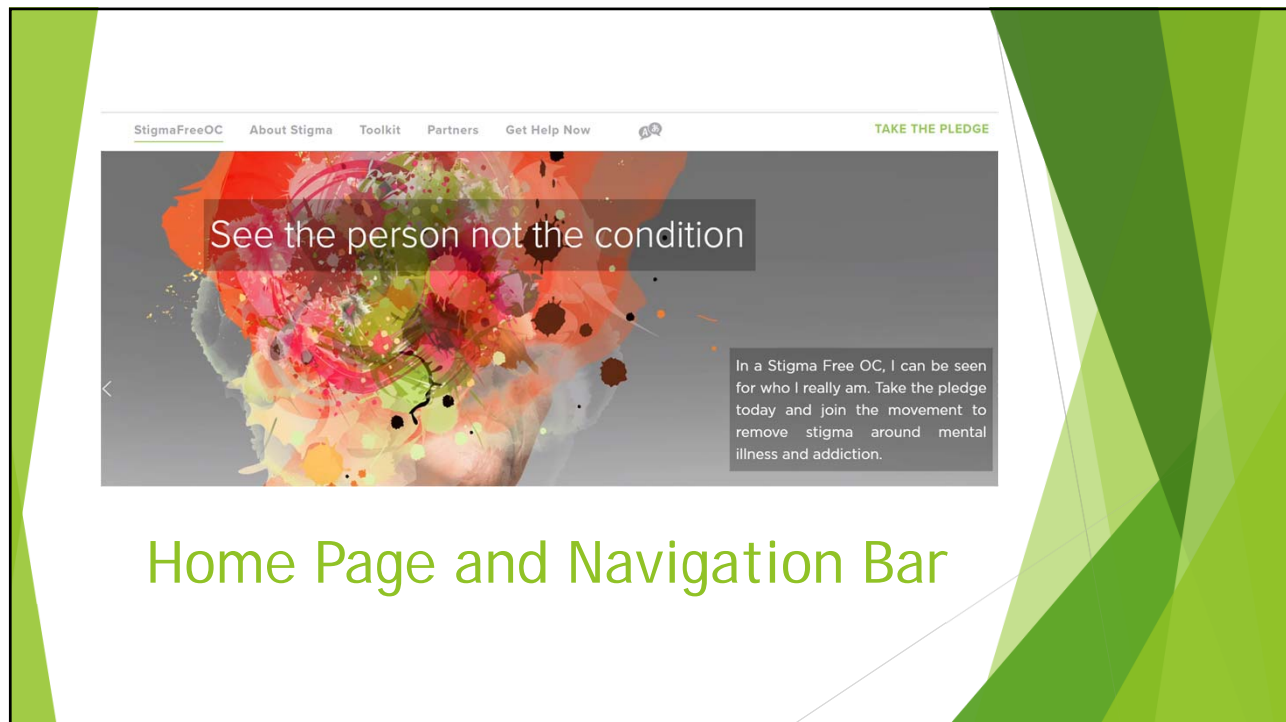


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Take a Pledge to be Stigma Free

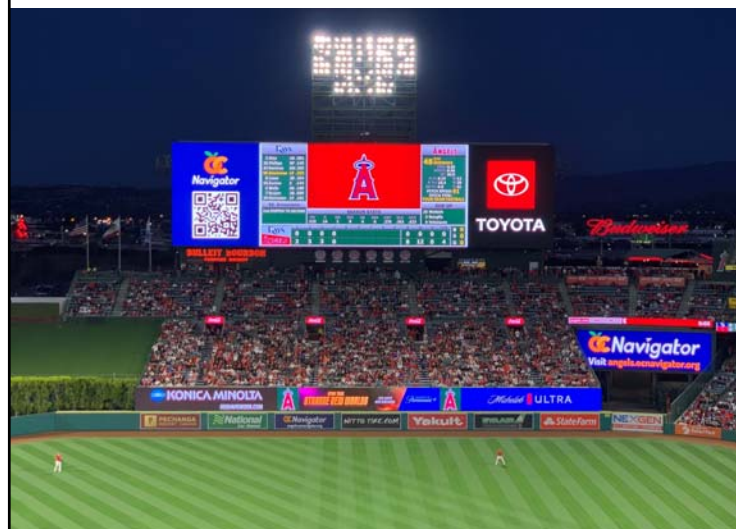

May 2022

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Levels of Care – Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Services for Youth

- **Outpatient:**
 - Outpatient Drug Free (ODF) – Level 1.0. Under 6 hours per week for adolescents
 - Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOT) – Level 2.1. A minimum of 6 hours and a maximum of 19 hours per week for adolescents.
- **Residential:**
 - 24-hour structure with a minimum of 5 hours of clinical services per week
 - Clinically Managed Low-Intensity Residential Services – Level 3.1
 - Clinically Managed Population-Specific High Intensity Residential Services – Level 3.3
 - Clinically Managed High-Intensity Residential Services – Level 3.5
- **Withdrawal Management**
 - Level 3.2 – Detoxification services

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SUD Outpatient Services

- Outpatient services are available to youth who have a substance use disorder or are at-risk for the development of one. Services may include:
 - Assessment
 - Care coordination
 - Individual and group counseling
 - Family therapy
 - Drug testing
 - Patient education

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SUD Residential Services

- Residential services are available to youth who have a substance use disorder. Services may include:
 - Assessment
 - Care Coordination
 - Individual and group counseling
 - Family therapy
 - Medication services
 - Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)
 - Drug testing
 - Patient education

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SUD Residential Treatment Provider for Youth

- Residential Treatment Provider for females 12-17 years old:

- Levels of Care (MAT is available within all levels of care):
 - 3.1 – Clinically Managed Low-Intensity Residential Services
 - 3.3 – Clinically Managed Population-Specific High Intensity Residential Services
 - 3.5 – Clinically Managed High-Intensity Residential Services
- Placement with an out-of-network provider in a neighboring County for adolescent males through single-case agreement

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SUD Withdrawal Management Services

- Level 3.2 Withdrawal Management Provider for females 12-17 years old:
 - [Sanctuary Recovery Center](#)
 - 20302 Flanagan Road, Trabuco Canyon; (949) 534-4715
- Services may include:
 - Assessment, care coordination, medication services, Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT), and observation

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Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for Youth

- Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) is available for the treatment of Opioid Use Disorder in youth
- MAT is currently available to youth in the following treatment settings:
 - Narcotic Treatment Program (NTP)
 - SUD Residential Treatment
 - SUD Withdrawal Management

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Narcotic Treatment Program (NTP) for Youth

- Services may include:
 - Assessment, care coordination, individual and group counseling, family therapy, medical psychotherapy, MAT, and patient education

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Co-Occurring Behavioral Health Providers for Youth

- Children & Youth Services (CYS) Mental Health Plan (MHP) programs provide co-occurring treatment
- **CYS MHP providers will link with an SUD provider when more intensive services are needed**
 - CEGU Probation completes an ASAM-based assessment on all youth screened with moderate to severe SUD and refers to residential treatment
- **CYS County-operated and contracted co-occurring providers:**
 - Regional Outpatient Clinics – 0 to 21 years old
 - Full Service Partnership (FSP) programs – ages vary by program, ranging from children to young adults
