

Homeless Veterans on Veteran Registry




Currently, there are 260 veterans on the Veteran Registry including 238 veterans experiencing homelessness. In the previous 12 months, 243 veterans have been housed in permanent, stable housing. Over 30 agencies, including the VA Community Resource and Referral Center, outreach providers, and shelter providers, continue to meet weekly to coordinate housing and services for veterans experiencing homelessness in Orange County. In the past 12 months, there has been an 8% increase in the number of veterans experiencing homelesness in Orange County.




As of March 1, 2023:

- 242 TAY Households in CES
- TAY Housing Interest
 - Rapid Rehousing 67
 - Permanent Supportive Housing- 71
 - Housing Choice Voucher 143
- Majority of matches are to vouchers and SU4K's JTS project
 - 11 Journey To Self Sufficiency (38%)
 - 12 Housing Vouchers (41%)


Virtual Front Door Update – 211 OC

CES Steering Committee 03/01/2023

- Housing/Shelter needs accounted for 50.4% of total calls to 2-1-1.
- Of these, majority of referrals were to CES Access Points, followed by Emergency Shelter, then
 prevention/Housing Expense Assistance.
- GetHelpOC closed-loop referral pilot showed that majority of returned referrals with no known capacity were housing related (Aug-Jan).


