


## Inflow by Year

Year ● 2021 ● 2022




## Outflow by Year






## Service Planning Area Breakdown

Service Planning Area ● (Blank) ● Central SPA ● North SPA ● South SPA








## Access Points on TAY Registry



## Avg Household Income




## TAY Gender by Project Type

# Sanctuary Recovery Center Residential Substance Use Treatment for Teenage Girls



*Remote Location in Trabuco Canyon, CA*

Sanctuary Recovery Center (SRC) is part of Vera's Sanctuary for Women (VSW), which is a subsidiary of The Teen Project, Inc. SRC is a 6-bed, short-term residential treatment program for young women ages 15 to 17. Our clients must have a primary Substance Use Disorder (SUD), and they may also have co-occurring mental health conditions. Our program can provide healing and hope for female youth who have been in out-of-home placement (e.g., foster care); have been abused, neglected, and/or abandoned; have been victims of sex trafficking (Commercially Sexually Exploited Children); are pregnant; are gang-involved; are runaways; and/or are homeless. SRC is a Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) program funded through the Orange County Health Care Agency, Mental Health and Recovery Services. We work with our clients to assess their strengths and needs across all major life areas (e.g., substance use, physical and mental health, education, family support, living environment, etc.) then provide individualized treatment to help them work toward their self-identified goals.



Clients are expected to participate in the following elements of treatment:

- ✓ Detoxification (if needed)
- ✓ 6 to 8 hours of individual and/or group therapy per day
- ✓ Drug testing twice per week
- ✓ Individual counseling twice per week, as well as family counseling/support as appropriate
- ✓ Personalized treatment plans that include substance use/relapse prevention, medical, mental health, educational, legal, family, and aftercare/vocational goals
- ✓ Participation in school 2 hours per day, 5 days per week with the support of a credentialed teacher
- ✓ Emotional expression through music and art
- ✓ Aftercare/permanency planning

### Therapeutic Curriculum:

SRC uses several evidence-based practices during individual and group therapy, including:

- Stages of Change Model
- Motivational Interviewing
- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT)
- Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT)
- Family Systems Theory
- 12-step model (AA/NA)
- Relapse Prevention

These interventions are designed to help our clients reduce impulsivity, develop effective coping skills to manage intense emotions and high-risk-for relapse situations, learn effective problem-solving and communication skills, and improve interpersonal relationships.

Our campus is a gated community with security cameras and 24/7 staffing to ensure the safety of our clients.
