

Permanent Housing Resources Overview

The Orange County Coordinated Entry System (CES) refers to many permanent housing programs in Orange County. There are three types of permanent housing opportunities that are prioritized and made available through CES: (1) rapid rehousing, (2) other permanent housing and (3) permanent supportive housing.

Permanent Housing Resource	Rental Assistance	Supportive Services
<p>Rapid Rehousing (RRH) RRH provides time limited-rental assistance paired with time-limited supportive services. There is no minimum income requirement for participating in RRH. The goal of RRH is to increase or maintain income to be able to keep paying rent after the rental assistance ends.</p>	<p>Short-Term Up to 6 months</p> <p>Medium-Term Up to 12 months</p> <p>Long-Term Up to 24 months</p>	<p>Time Limited Supportive Services</p>
<p>Other Permanent Housing (OPH) OPH includes ongoing rental assistance with the tenant paying 30% of their income towards housing. This housing assistance comes with limited to no supportive services.</p>	<p>Ongoing Rental Assistance</p>	<p>Minimal to No Supportive Services</p>
<p>Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) PSH provides ongoing rental assistance with intensive ongoing supportive services. Participation in supportive services is voluntary. Households experiencing chronic homelessness are primarily prioritized for PSH.</p>	<p>Ongoing Rental Assistance</p>	<p>Ongoing Supportive Services</p>
