# Discussion of OCCJCC Bylaws

- **Add HCA as Voting Member**

A. Membership of the OCCJCC is to be composed as follows:

1. Two members of the Board of Supervisors serving as Chair and Vice-Chair as appointed by the Board of Supervisors
2. Presiding Judge, Superior Court
3. Presiding Judge, Juvenile Court
4. District Attorney
5. Public Defender
6. Chief Probation Officer
7. Sheriff-Coroner
8. Large City Police Chief (over 100,000 population) appointed by the Chair
9. Small City Police Chief (under 100,000 population) appointed by the Chair
10. Health Care Agency
11. County Executive Officer

# Discussion of OCCJCC Bylaws

- **Chair and Vice Chair to delegate authority to another Voting Member**

A. OCCJCC officers shall consist of:

1. The Chair, as appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and the Vice-Chair acting in absence of the Chair.
2. If the Chair and Vice-Chair are not able to serve in their capacity at a regular or special meeting, the Chair may designate another Voting Member to serve as Chair for that meeting.
3. The Chair shall preside at meetings, call special meetings, decide points of order, announce all business, entertain motions, put motions to vote, announce vote results, appoint and may remove committee Chairpersons, and represent the OCCJCC at public functions.

# Approval of Meeting Calendar 2026

## Per Bylaws:

### ARTICLE VIII. Meetings and Actions

Regular meetings shall occur monthly on the **third Friday of the month at 9:00 a.m.** at the County Administration South (CAS) building in the County Conference Center A. The OCCJCC Chair may present and adopt an alternate calendar for the year at either the last regular meeting of the prior year or the first meeting of the new year.

**Alternate Calendar: Third Friday of the month at 9:30 a.m.**

- Producing other recidivism measures
  - Return to jail
  - Arrest
- AB109 Population

  - Developing yearly cohorts to compare to the overall recidivism

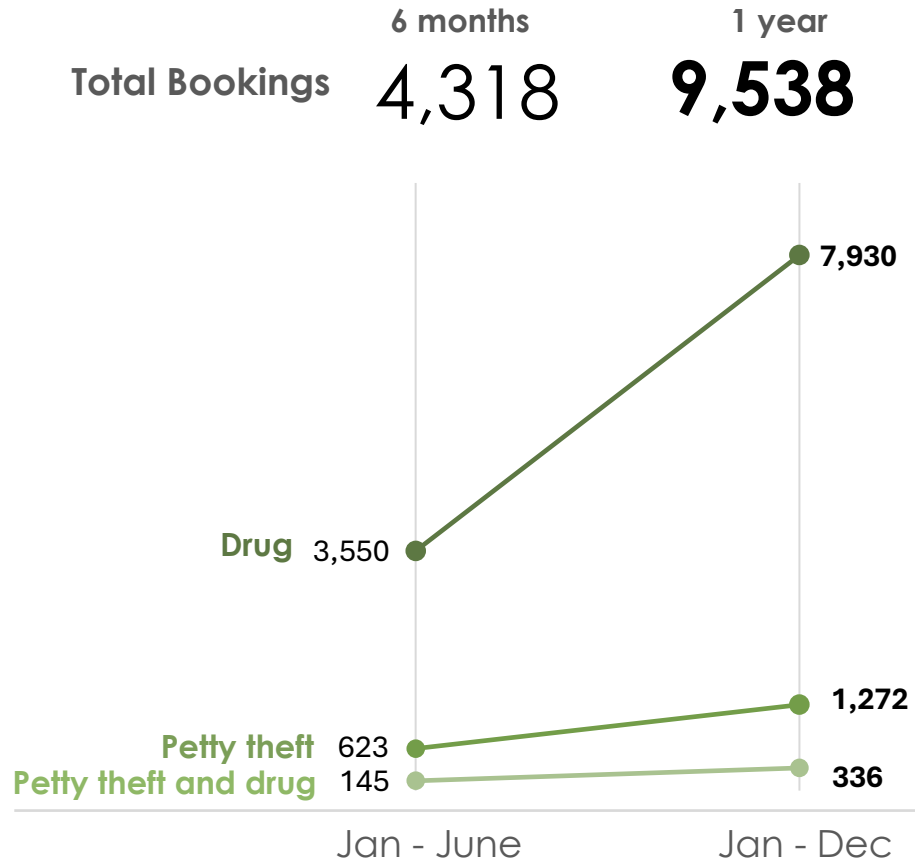

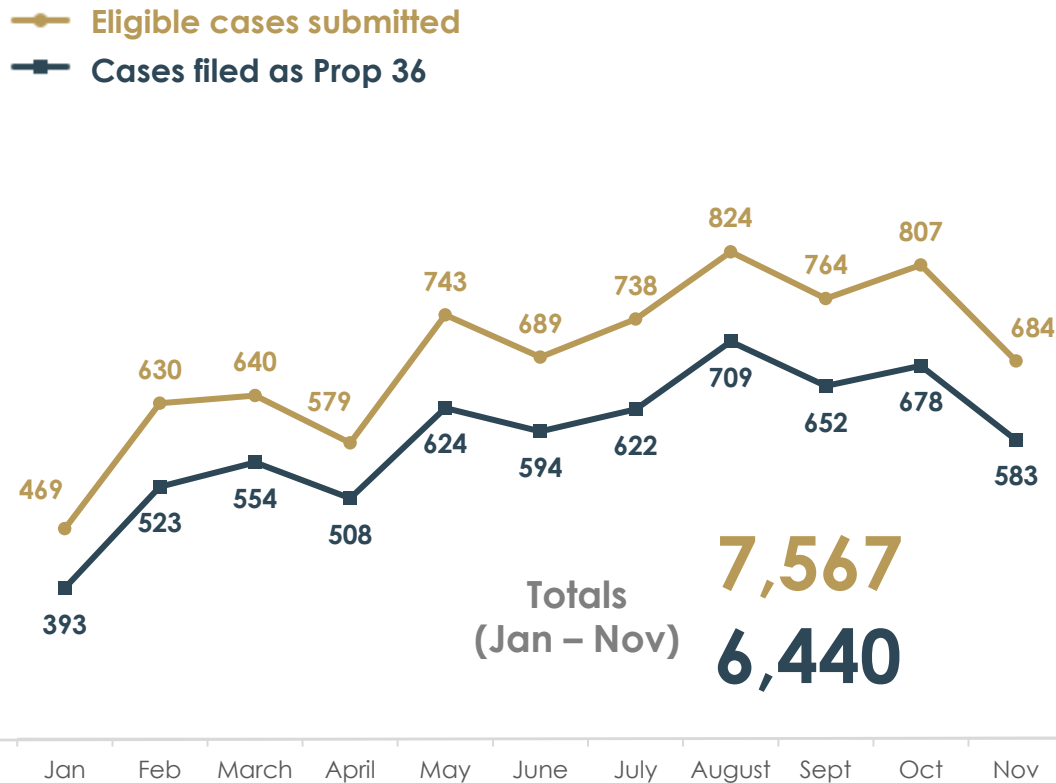

## Phase 2 OCDA & Courts: Case Submissions and Filings

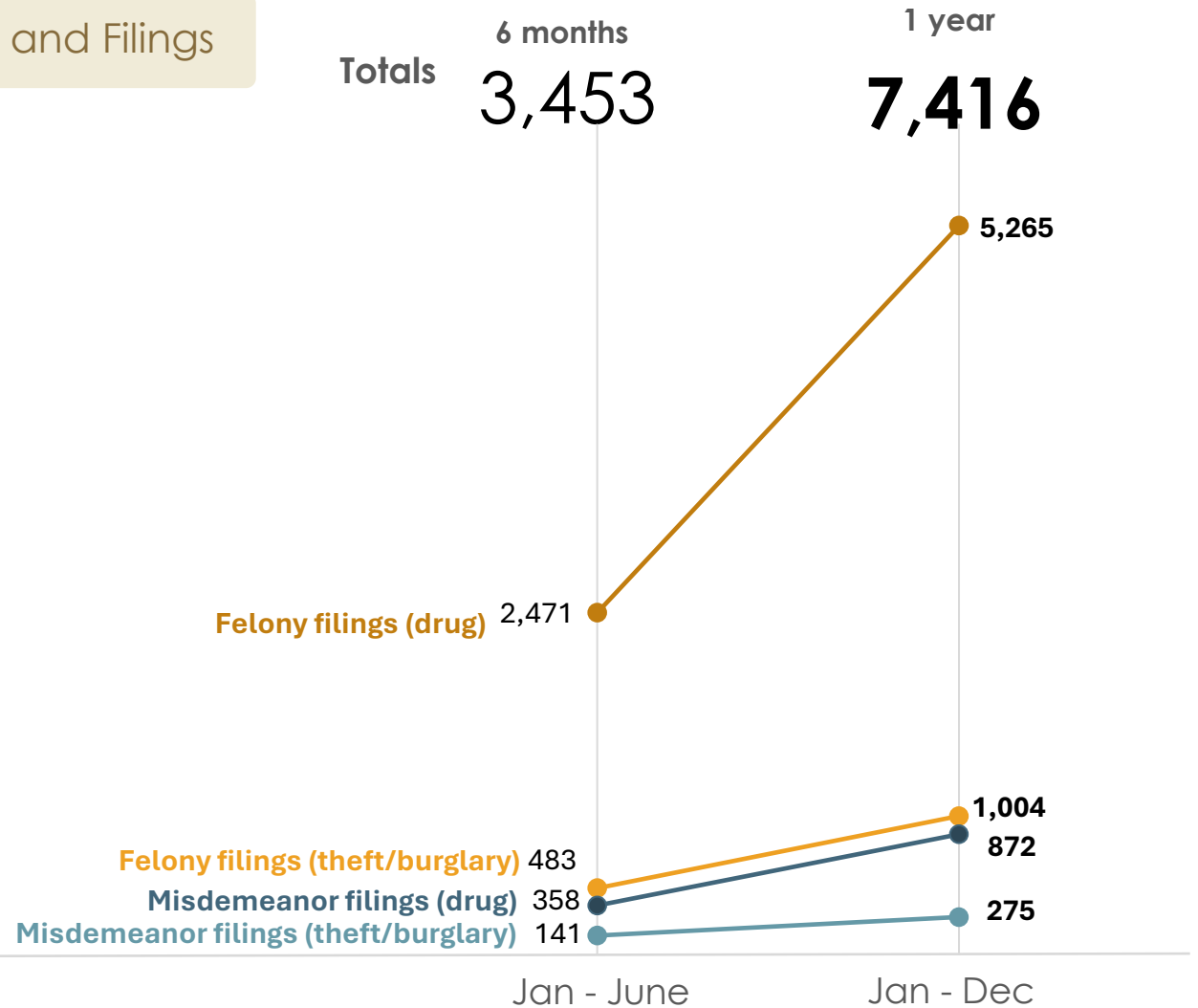
### OCDA Filed and Charged Prop36 by Month

Note: Filings are counted by person per case. Misdemeanor filing counts include OCDA and Anaheim City Attorney.

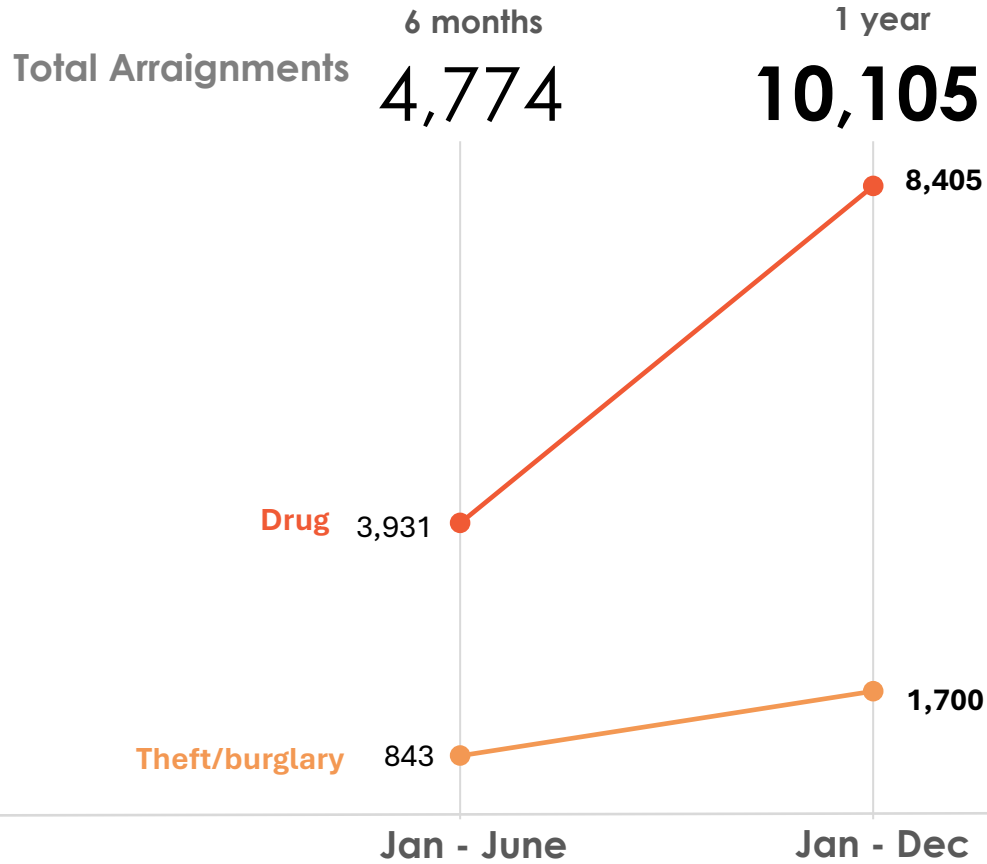

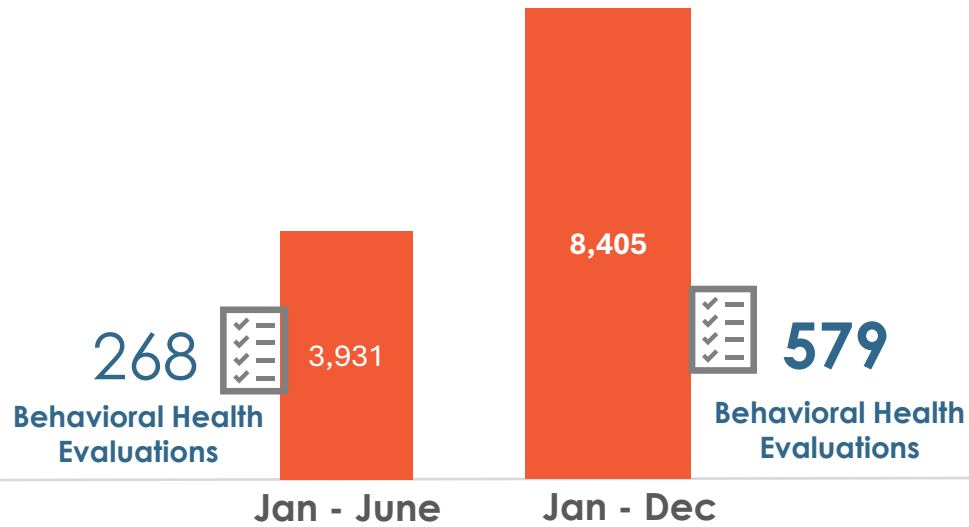

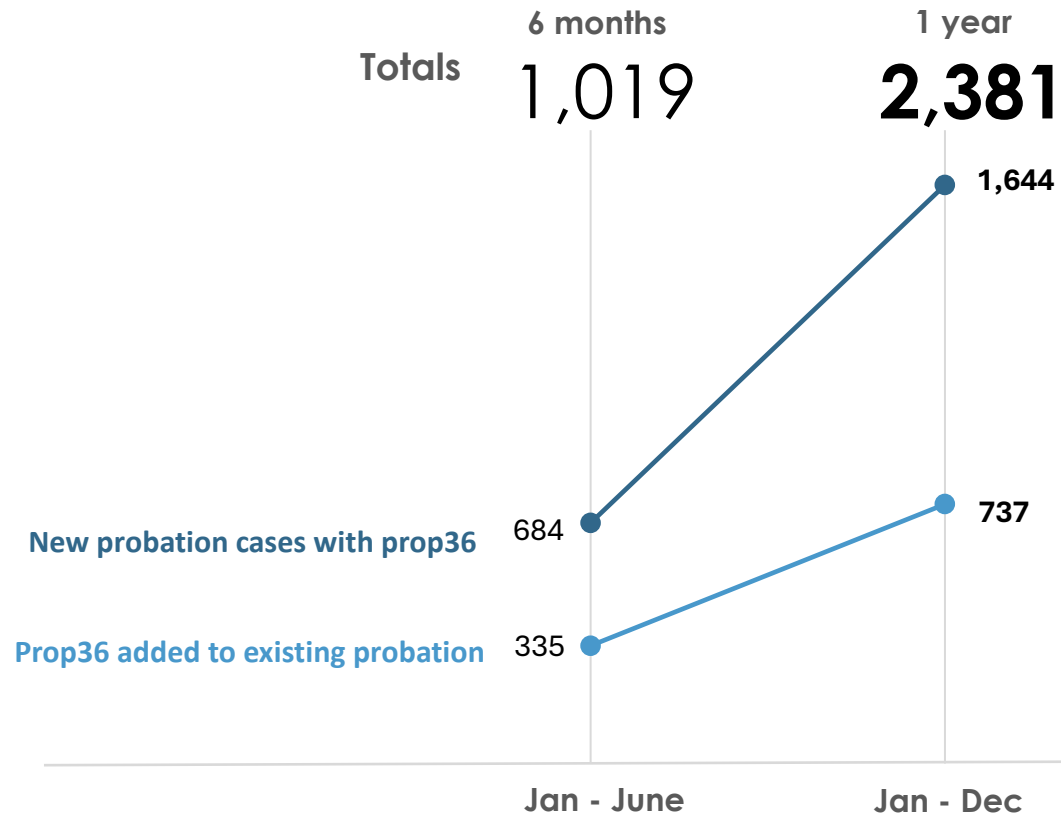

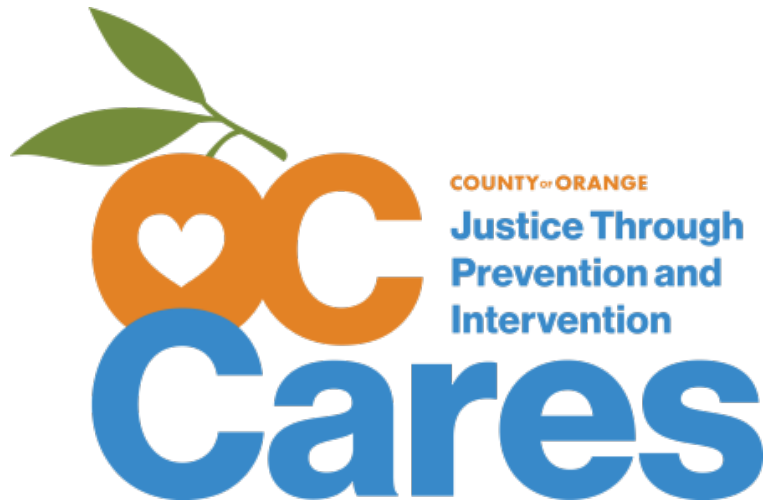

# Challenge Identification



## Youth Diversion Programs

Purpose: To provide programs where the youth, juveniles or TAY populations can receive the needed treatment or services to address underlying issues that may lead to involvement with the juvenile justice system.

Obtain and assess the programs and services provided by local law enforcement agencies targeting the youth, juvenile and TAY populations in an effort to prevent them from entering the juvenile justice system. Identify gaps or duplication and address as appropriate.

# Police-based Diversion Expansion

- \* \$8M grant over 4 years
- \* 22 Police departments and the Sheriff's Department
- \* Only two police-based diversion programs prior
- \* Partnering with three CBOs to replicate police-based diversion in the highest referring cities and more
- \* Seeks to reduce referrals to Probation Department formal and informal processing and rearrests
  - Redirect Probation resources
  - Speed up support to families in need
